Geography: Term 3 &4

#### PE

The fundamental movement and ball skills to be developed through Physical Education this term include: rolling, balancing, running, jumping, hopping, dodging, skipping, bouncing, throwing, catching, kicking and striking.

## Music

Students will remember the form of simple songs, take turns at listening and performing, respond to conducting cues and learn a variety of songs using musical elements. With support, we will compose, practice and perform art works.

#### **STEM**

We are exploring the components of digital systems and sorting them into two categories: hardware and software. We will learn the importance of details when coding small robotic devices and explore the needs and uses for winter produce and how we can set up gardening systems for the cooler months.

Students will be learning how to talk about simple daily routines such as brushing their teeth and what they eat for various meals.
