Mathematics

This term, our focus will be on the strands of number and place value. Key areas of focus in Term 2 will be:

- Solving problems involving purchases and calculating change
- Multiplying and dividing numbers in a range of contexts using a range of strategies.
- Understanding fractions as equal shares, a collection of a set and placing fractions on a number line.
- Introducing students to improper and mixed fractions

Throughout each week, students will engage in fluency and problem-solving based activities, they will be encouraged to explain their reasoning.

English

Genre: Information Report

Spelling Mastery: A targeted program with explicit instruction that teaches students dependable spelling skills by blending three approaches – the phonemic approach, the whole word approach and the morphemic approach. Reading: Students will regularly read in small groups to enhance their fluency and reading comprehension. This will be done through guided and reciprocal reading. Room 1 will also be reading the novel 'RatBurger' by David Walliams. Students will be predicting, summarizing and visualising based on this novel.

Writing

The focus this term is on information reports. Students will identify the 4 different sentences types. Students will identify key words in texts and develop an understanding of simple, compound and complex sentences.

HASS

Students will continue to explore the impact the First Fleet had on the traditional owners of the land and the environment.

Science

All students will conduct scientific investigations, identify fair testing and use formal measurements to record observations. Year 4 students will investigate and explain the common properties of different materials and determine their use. They will develop an understanding of how Aboriginal peoples select and use natural materials. Year 3 students will be focusing on Biological Science and learn about the seven characteristics of living things.

PE

Fundamental movement skills to be developed through Physical Education will be taught through sport specific skill and game play development in tag rugby league and hockey this term. Fitness will be measured by three standardised tests.

Music

Students will participate collaboratively with others to produce art and identify the form of songs. We will continue to use elements of music and musical language to provide each other with feedback on performances.

STEM

Students will be furthering their knowledge of digital systems and learning more about how their work can be operated. This includes the use of coding systems to support winter produce and food technology.

Indonesian

'Wayang Kulit' - Students will hear the story of Ramayana through storytelling and drama. They will make wayang kulit (shadow puppets) and learn the cultural background to their use in storytelling. Students will respond to the story in Indonesian and in Enalish.
