Weeks 1-10:

Fractions -

Investigate equivalent fractions using halves, quarters and thirds, representing these fractions on a number line and in context.

Weeks 1-10:

Measurement-

Students will develop an understanding of the purpose and use of measurement through the use of scaled measurement tools in real world situations.

Science

Students will investigate the roles and interactions of consumers, producers and decomposers within a habitat and how food chains represent feeding relationships.

Genre: Information Report

Spelling Mastery: A targeted program with explicit instruction that teaches students dependable spelling skills by blending three approaches - the phonemic approach, the whole word approach and the morphemic approach.

Reading: Students will regularly read in small groups to enhance their fluency and reading comprehension. This will be done through guided and reciprocal reading.

Writing

Students will participate in tasks to support their persuasive writing skills. They will continue to work on extending sentences using a variety of conjunctions, such as because, but, so and if.

HASS

Students will explore how rules and laws affect themselves and the importance of laws in society as students explore cultural diversity in their community.

Health

Students will explore strategies to interact safely, securely, and respectfully online

PE

Fundamental movement skills to be developed through Physical Education will be taught through sport specific skill and game play development in volleyball and Olympic handball this term. Fitness will be measured by three standardised tests.

Music

In the Middle Primary years, students will continue to participate in music lessons collaboratively to practice and perform songs in familiar settings. This will include an expectation of singing in pitch and keeping a steady beat and rhythm. We will actively listen to our sound and reflect on how we might improve our performed art. We will explore music from a variety of cultures and times including First Nation Australians, country artist Colin Buchanan and traditional folk songs from France and Yugoslavia.

STEM

Year 3-4 Students will continue to explore digital systems with a lens of how data is collected and stored. Students will be supported to understand what data is and how it can be secured in digital systems.
