Reception - Term 4 - Curriculum Overview, 2023



Maths

Equal Sharing and Grouping

Students will be able to develop an understanding of the term 'equal', be able to identify and create equal groups and solve problems by sharing. **Statistics**

Students will collect and sort data from their everyday lives, create data displays, including tables and picture graphs. Students will answer questions by sorting, organising, and reading data.

Quantity Part -Part whole 10-20

Students will deepen their understanding of quantities beyond ten, by comparing quantities, partitioning numbers up to 20 and finding missing parts through subitising and deep part-part-whole knowledge. Students will explore the place value concept of teen numbers as 1 ten and some more. Space and Location

Students will name, recognise and draw 2D shapes. Students explore Students will use directional language to describe the position and location of an object, and themselves, compared to another object or person.

During our InitiaLit lessons this term, the children will learn the final lettersound correspondences. By now, routines are very well established and the children are continuing to gain confidence in their reading and writing skills.

The last two sets of the Foundation Program will see the children being able to tackle words that have four phonemes (e.g. stop, sand etc.) These words are referred to as CVCC & CCVC words (consonant, vowel, consonant, consonant words & consonant, consonant, vowel consonant). The children will now know all single letter-sound correspondences, so the reading of these longer regular words is simply taking the next step, using the same strategies of segmenting and blending that they have been practicing all year.

Students will write simple information reports showing their understanding of the structure and key components of an information report, including classification, appearance, habitat, diet and interesting facts.

PE
