English

Genre: Procedural Writing

Students will be learning to read and write a set of instructions that are in sequence.

Poetry

Students will be using poetic devices such as rhyme and alliteration to create sports chants, limericks and tongue twisters.

Spelling Mastery: A targeted program with explicit instruction that teaches students dependable spelling skills by blending three approaches – the phonemic approach, the whole word approach and the morphemic approach.

Reading: Students will regularly read in small groups to enhance their fluency and reading comprehension. This will be done through guided and reciprocal reading.

Maths

Week 1-10:

Money: Students will be solving money problems to the nearest 5c. They will be describing and continuing number patterns from using multiplication in the form of worded problems.

Week 1-10:

Chance: Describe possible everyday events and order their chances of occurring.

Time:Use 'am' and 'pm' notation and solve simple time problems.

Science

What on Earth...?

Students will develop an understanding of how natural processes and

human activity can cause slow or rapid change to the Earth's surface.

Through exploration, practical investigations and modelling they will understand the natural processes of weathering, erosion and deposition. Students will determine how these processes can cause changes to the Earth's surface and create new landforms. They will broaden their understanding of how weathering, erosion and deposition results in the production of sediment and soil.

Health

Students will look at the benefits of being healthy and physically active and discuss the influences on healthy and safe choices.

PE

Fundamental movement skills to be developed through Physical Education will be taught through sport specific skill and game play development in baseball 5 and Olympic handball this term.

Writing

Students will engage in tasks to support them in expanding their sentences. Students will use a range of subordinating conjunctions to create complex sentences to enhance their writing.

STEM

This term students will be exploring how to solve problems by collaborating with others. They will be using a range of strategies to record the design process and present their process to others. They will look into the benefits food technologies provide for health and food safety, and explore how food can be prepared for healthy eating.

Indonesian

'Rumah saya' (My house) — Students will be learning how to describe their/and other houses using adjectives. They will be looking at rooms in a house and learning how to say what part of their daily routine occurs in each room. Students will be describing who lives in their household.

HASS

Continuing the unit topic of Civics and Citizenship. Students will be able to identify the levels of government, explore and identify structures in their local community and ways to contribute to their community.

The Arts - Dance

This term all classes R-6 will be engaging in dance as preparation for our 'End of Year Concert'. The 'End of Year Concert' will take place on Thursday the 7^{th} December and serves two purposes for us here at Largs Bay School.
